Volunteer Opportunities

coordinated by The Illinois Prairie Path not-for-profit corporation (IPPc)

- Volunteer or Become a Coordinator for the Annual Earth Day Trail Cleanup, usually on the fourth Saturday in April. We need approximately 1,000 volunteers. Additionally, we need people to adopt a section of the trail and maintain it year-round. Litter along the IPP is picked up solely by volunteers.
- Refill Map Boxes, as needed, with the free maps we provide.
- Participate in a Monthly Workday Activity, such as painting a water pump or weeding a flower box. These are usually held on the third Saturday morning of the month (spring through fall) to add, improve/maintain or change a trail amenity. No special skills are required, just energy and a community spirit.
- Monitor a Trash Can. If trash was not collected, call Waste Management.

Report if Observed

- Illegal dumping on the trails in DuPage County to the Div. of Transportation, 630-407-6883. In Kane County call their Forest Preserve District at 630-232-5980. In Cook County call the respective Village Hall where the dumping occurred (Berkeley, Bellwood, Hillside, Maywood, or Forest Park).
- Maintenance problems (graffiti, downed trees, surface problems) to 630-407-6920.

FREE Map of the Illinois Prairie Path

The Illinois Prairie Path is a 62-mile hiking, biking, equestrian and nature trail in Cook, DuPage and Kane Counties. The IPP runs from Forest Park on the east to Wheaton, then branches to Elgin and Aurora (with additional spurs to Geneva and Batavia). This map shows the four intersections of the IPP with the Fox River Trail—Elgin, Geneva, Batavia and Aurora—and only the southern 22 miles of the 56-mile Fox River Trail (Kane Co.) and Prairie Trail (McHenry Co.). The DuPage Co. portion of the Great Western Trail is 11.5 miles long, joining the IPP in West Chicago and Villa Park. The western half of the GWT starts at LeRoy Oakes Forest Preserve in Kane Co.
